What Is the Best Way to Do Benchmarking?

When performing benchmarks with VEE for Windows, remember that the PC clock has a minimum resolution characteristic. If you are doing benchmarks, make sure you do them for a sufficiently long time to reduce the effect of this error to a small value for your application. Test for consistency in your results.
